## Supermarkets

In Austria we have two "supermarkets" where you can find Dr.Schär and similar glutenfree products - Billa (yellow sign) offers Dr.Schär and Spar (like Eurospar in Italy) offers its own line "free from". Theese are the cheapest options to buy glutenfree food. You can find these two companies almost round every corner in Vienna.

Furthermore we have D\&M and Prokopp. Not all stores of D\&M have a big amount of glutenfree food. Some only have snacks lice rice waffles or chocolate bars. Whereas Prokopp has a huge amount of both organic and non organic products, therefore it is more expensive than the other opportunities.
There are Prokopp stores at Rochusmarkt (Landstraßer Hauptstraße 47-49, 1030 Vienna), Gersthof (Gersthofer Straße 57, 1180 Vienna) open 9.00-18.00 Mo-Sa.

## FURTHER NOTES

Please note that glutenfree eating culture in Austria is quite young and not as advanced as in Southern Tyrol, America or Canada. So make sure that you only eat products with the official glutenfree Symbol. To avoid misunderstandings ask once, twice or even ten times to make sure that you do not eat any food containing gluten.
